Announcements/Community Outlook:

- Shelley Baxter (Klickitat):
 - Klickitat still evaluating what will come regarding future cuts.
 - o Transportation is good until at least June 2025.
- > Kathy Briggs (Wahkiakum):
 - o Senior Hero Awards coming up in March 2025 (awaiting confirmation of a specific date).
 - Covers both Wahkiakum and Cowlitz counties.
 - The Senior Hero Awards recognize local individuals or organizations who have been real heroes to the seniors in the community.
 - This is the 3rd year that Wahkiakum is holding The Senior Hero Awards.
 - Kathy is continuing to build up numbers in the weekly senior friendship group that is every Wednesday.
 - Kathy is also continuing her efforts in trying to recruit people for the vacant Wahkiakum County Advisory Council Member position.
- > Sue Cameron (Clark): Nothing new to report.
- > Gavin Carmichael (Klickitat): Nothing new to report.
- > Diane Craft Shared by Christina Marneris on Diane's behalf (Cowlitz):
 - Diane wanted to remind anyone associated with Cowlitz County that the Kelso Senior Center is transitioning into more of a community center inviting general public to utilize space or rent, depending on the purpose. Senior activities are still present but are not the entire focus.

- o Longview has the Victory Diabetes and Primary Clinic staffed with Dr. Sebastian. His patient panel is adults, no pediatrics. He has been in clinic for several months and is accepting new patients.
- Greg Flakus (Clark):
 - Attended several FISH of Vancouver (Community Food Bank in Clark County) meetings and they
 are reporting that numbers utilizing the service have gone up but there are also increases in food
 supplies (not eggs though) and volunteers.
 - Greg offered to help in providing a tour of the FISH facility if anyone is interested.
 - o Greg also shared several articles of interest that he has recently read.
- Mary Repar (Skamania):
 - o Skamania County Senior Services still doesn't have a director.
 - o Full-time cook at Skamania County Senior Services is working out well.
 - Mary expressed that community members are concerned about Social Security and personal data.
- > Apryl Schneider (Clark): Nothing new to report.

Reports:

<u>Executive Director's Report</u>: Mike thanked everyone for sharing what is going on in their local communities. He expressed appreciation of members' advocacy and commitment for older adults and individuals with disabilities in their communities.

- > High School Home Care Aide Program (HSHCA):
 - Mike thanked Kathy Briggs for her assistance in making a connection with Kyle at Wahkiakum High School to discuss the HSHCA Program.
 - Mike met with Kyle from Wahkiakum High School and sent information about the HSHCA Program to both Kyle and Stephanie (SW Rural Co-Op).
 - Mike is working to set up a meeting with Kyle and Vickei Hrdina. Dates have been proposed over the next two weeks.

> Federal Administration:

- Federal Funding Concerns:
 - Medicaid Washington State Congressional Rep. Dan Newhouse (District 4) is viewed as a key vote/player in stopping cuts to Medicaid. He is a member of the House Appropriations Committee.
 - Mike joined the Central WA Efforts Against Medicaid Cuts Coalition weekly meeting.
 - Lori Brown (SE AAA) + AC Members are meeting with Rep. Newhouse today.
 - Current Continuing Resolution ends 3/14/25
- USAging and others are working to have OAA reauthorized.

Legislative Advocacy:

- o State
 - Following SB5222/HB1217 Improving housing stability for tenants subject to the residential landlord-tenant act and the manufactured/mobile home landlord-tenant act by limiting rent and fee increases, requiring notice of rent and fee increases, limiting fees and deposits, establishing a landlord resource center and associate services, authorizing tenant lease termination, creating parity between lease types, and providing for attorney general enforcement.

Public Comment:

- > Rick Seekins provided an update about Vista Del Rio Manufactured Home community in Vancouver being placed up for sale and the concerns surrounding it for the residents.
 - The park residents did work through the process of trying to purchase the park however it didn't work out for a variety of reasons (including the price on the park was too high).
 - o All signs are pointing to the current owners not selling the park at this time.
 - The park residents received a lot of community support and endorsements from surrounding HOA's.
 - The park residents are actively involved in trying to get some zoning changes that will help protect manufactured home parks.
 - Several of the park residents are forming a non-profit organization strictly for residents to help protect their interests, specifically protecting those who are being priced out of their homes to constant rent increases.

 Rick shared he is a board member of the Salvation Army and shared information about some of the services they offer such as the foodbank, case management services and rental assistance. Rick offered to help facilitate tours of the facility for those interested.
